



Minutes of Sedgefield Tennis Club Committee held on the 17th July 2019 at 10 Mossie St.

1. Chairman welcomed all present and Pam Booth's apology accepted.
2. Minutes of the 19th June were proposed Mike and seconded Ian as being correct.
3. SARS. The Club Chairman and new Treasurer have been to S A R S and have got an extension on the Financials which are outstanding. Finances are in a good state with total amount in both accounts being R 312 K and a refundable deposit at the municipality for the building extension of R 11 401 . Banking is now also sorted out with OTP and Phil now has access. Mike still takes the cash from the Club and balances amounts.
4. Bowling Club proposal. Dave Jooste, Chairman of bowls, convened a meeting which was attended by our Chairman, Phil, George and Cliff.

Proposal is to enlarge the Bowls Clubhouse behind the Tennis Clubhouse, aiming at forming a Sports Club encompassing all the different sports with a 500 member listing. The new Spar could well be involved in this development. Fears were raised that we could not afford to lose our income from our bar and this was raised at the Meeting.

This Social Sports Club would then have representatives from each body serving on a committee. Should this eventuate there would be an enormous cost saving to the Tennis Club. Cliff and Phil were proposed to serve on this steering committee. The secretary was asked to forward a list of all tennis members to the Bowls Club to try and reach the 500 number. Contact details will not be included.

5. Court Rejuvenation. The Chairman discussed previous quotes from different companies regarding the maintenance of the Courts. **Grand Slam** were very expensive with a figure of R 134 000 for the 3 courts being their bottom line, with differing amounts for different works that they offered. **Cape Civils** quoted R 32 900

p court (excl vat). These first two companies would also have required accommodation for the timespan that they would be working. **Johannes Roux**, a local, whose work the Committee are going to inspect, came in with a figure well below the others , R 20 000 and there is no hidden costs such as accommodation. The Committee were unanimous in deciding on him. He is also prepared to repair the wall. Lights.

A sub-committee of William, Ian and George are looking into the details of this regarding the specs and as soon as these are decided upon and costing cleared up members will be informed.

6. Wall repairs. Covered in previous point.
7. Friendly Matches. Two friendly games are being envisaged in the near future and all members will be invited to play on a first response basis.

These games will not be disruptive to normal social play.

8. Monday Tennis. The Committee were all in agreement that the Monday players are to provide their own balls as decided at the AGM or can buy old balls from the Club at R 10 p ball. Phil is to sell 57 balls used during the Championships.

The Committee have agreed to use a cleaning lady from the Bowling Club on a Thursday afternoon as required.

A set of keys has been issued to Martin as he is a regular player out of social times and is useful in opening the Club.

Mike is to look at the net on Court 2 as he did a fantastic job on the net on Court 3, for which the Committee thanked him.

With that the Meeting was adjourned.
